Introduction


Teaching Hospital Affiliation

Curriculum Overview

The College follows the 4-year BSN program curriculum (2025) approved by the Pakistan Nursing Council and Higher Education Commission. The curriculum is available on the PNC & UHS website.

As per HEC regulation, the BSN degree course work at Farrukh Mukhtar College of Nursing will be completed in 4-years/8-semesters. Altogether, there will be 185 credit hours (HEC requirement 130-140 credit hours) of which 70% of the curriculum will constitute discipline-specific (Nursing) and the remaining 30% (non-Nursing) will comprise compulsory and general courses. The academic year will be from January with summer and winter breaks in between.

Innovative teaching-learning strategies will be used such as Interactive classes, small group discussion, case studies, podcasts, vodcast, concept maps, discussions via web-ex, puzzles, interactive games, skills- based workshops, simulated lab, hands-on clinical experience, case discussion and management, and structured/unstructured post conferences.

Recognition and Affiliation

Before initiation of BSN training program, a 4-week enrichment training program is designed to enhance students' knowledge regarding Science, Mathematics, English, Ethics, Professionalism, and Studying Skills.

Admission Requirements

- Matric (Science) and FSc (Pre-Medical) with minimum 50% marks
- Candidates with similar qualifications must submit an equivalence certificate issued by the IBCC
- Age of the candidate must not exceed 35 years
- Admissions are subject to an entry test conducted by FMCON
- Interview conducted by the institute
- Open merit, at the discretion of the institution

MERIT CRITERIA:

Matric: 10% | FSc: 50% | Entry test: 40%

Merit-based admissions are open to female and male candidates. The admissions are open to male and female candidates from around the world. Admissions will be merit-based only (There are no quotas, reserved seats, or admission against donations). English is the medium of instruction. It will be important for the candidates to comprehend verbal and written content in English.

Discipline:
